Please record any reading your child does at home in their reading diaries.



Dear all,

I cannot believe we have arrived at the end of another week. The children have loved the sunny weather at lunchtimes and have continued to work hard in all areas of their learning.

As mathematicians this week, Year 1 have built upon their previous learning and have been representing their numbers to 10, whilst also consolidating their counting forwards and backwards in both numerals and words. They have also continued to practise their numeral formation and the progress in this area is fantastic in just a week!

Year 2 have been continuing to develop their understanding of place value in numbers up to 100. They have spent time identifying numbers which have been represented in different ways and explaining how they know the value of the number. Also this week, they have started to represent two-digit numbers in more than one way using the part-part whole model.



As geographers, we explored what an aerial view is and why it is used in maps. We spent time comparing it to the perspective that we see things in and how the views are different. Year 1 then used the ipads to capture images of different objects around our learning environment showcasing aerial and "street views". Year 2 wrote their own definition of an aerial view and then drew chosen objects from an aerial view perspective.

As global citizens, we have begun a new unit of learning that explores who are Muslims and what they believe. We learnt that in Arabic, the word God is Allah and that Muslims believe that all of creation was created by Allah. This links to our learning from Christianity and our Acts of Worship. We then drew an image of where we think you can find God, but we did not draw an image of Allah as Muslims believe that he is beyond human understanding and therefore cannot be portrayed in an image.
