This Week in Leas Foot

As mathematicians this week, Year 1 have started their new block of learning focusing on addition and subtraction within 10. They have begun with exploring part-part-whole models as a way of identifying the different ways numbers can be made up. They had the help of our old friends The Numberblocks to help them too! Year 2 have continued to focus on their addition and subtraction block and this week they have focused on finding ten more and ten less of any two-digit number. As a class we recognised that when you add or subtract ten to a two-digit number, the ones stay the same, but the tens change.

As historians, we looked at a historical source to identify some of the different games that people used to play in the past. We then compared them to the games we play now and recognised that we still play so many!

As artists this week, we began to construct our final pieces inspired by the work of Yvonne Coomber. We created a simple colour wash using watercolours and over the coming weeks, we will be adding layers and techniques to create some stunning pieces.

As scientists, we learnt about wind and how it can be measured. It turns out measuring wind is a very hard thing to do! We learnt about Sir Francis Beaufort and his wind scale, and how Mrs Callard gets worried when we reach a Force 6!
