### Steeple Cove Nursery

This week Steeple Cove have been focusing on ..... '2D shapes'

The children really enjoyed recreating a 2D shapes in rice, they chose a shape to trace with their fingers to make the shape as well as counting the sides and corners to learn how many corners shape are made of.

We've been making pictures using only 2D shapes, the children named the shapes they were using to make their pictures. The children made pictures of rockets, boats, houses, tractors and so much more.

## Yarmer Reception / Year One

This week the Reception children have blown me away with their incredible writing. All the hard work that they have been putting into learning their sounds is really starting to pay off! We read the book 'How to Catch a Star' by Oliver Jeffers. It is a beautiful story about a boy who wishes beyond anything that he could catch a star. The children thought about what their biggest wish might be and wrote a sentence about this. Some wishes included: 'I wish I had piles and piles of gold.' 'I wish I had a magic necklace that turned me into a mermaid', 'I wish I was a ninja.', 'I wish I lived in France.' Within their maths learning, the Year Ones have been deepening their understanding of numbers to 20. They have been leaning about how to use their knowledge of number bonds to 10 to help them workout number bonds to 20. Within their Art, the children have begun to study the photographer and sculptor Andy Goldsworthy. The children learnt that Goldsworthy creates many of his sculptures using natural materials that he finds within the environment. Much of his work is temporary and therefore can only be seen through photographs. The children spent time analysing and critiquing Goldsworthy's work and will work towards creating a piece in the style of Goldsworthy.
