
Dear Families,

friends from West Alvington and Charleton.



Steeple Cove Nursery

This week Steeple Cove have been focusing on ... Land, air and sea.

We have learnt that animals and different modes of transport either belong on the land or in the sea and sea, we've been investigating which ones belong where.

The children have been getting creative and making junk modal animals and vehicles. They decided on what they would like to make then came up with facts about the vehicle or animal. Then they all discussed if it would belong in the sea or sky or on the land. Great investigating everyone!

The children made a collaborative map where they have each added colourings of different animals and modes of transport. As a class we have been adding these on to the map corresponding to land, air and sea. Our map looks fantastic!

Yarmer Reception / Year One

Within their science learning, the Year Ones used the story of The Three Little Pigs to continue exploring materials and their properties. They made predictions about different materials and how they will withstand wind and weight. They will make houses and test their predictions next week.
