Did you know...The link between attendance and attainment is clear:

- In 2018/19, just 40% of persistently absent (PA) children with attendance below 90% in KS2 achieved expected KS2 standards, compared with 84% of pupils who regularly attended school.
- 36% of PA children in KS4 got 9 to 4 in their English and maths GCSEs, compared with 84% of regular attenders.

Yarmer Reception / Year One

This week has been a slightly unusual for the whole school and has meant all classes making changes to routine and lessons. It has been wonderful to see how everyone had rallied around the Year 6s and cheered them on as they completed their SATS — well done Year Six! Within the classroom Year One and Reception have been focusing on their phonics and sentence writing. We have been using the correct punctuation including capital letters, finger spaces and full stops — these still sometimes get forgotten! We have been practising using positional language within our Maths. The children have been using the vocabulary left, right, above, below, forward, backwards, whole turn, half-turn, quarter-turn and three-quarter turn to describe position and turns. We have also been learning about ordinal numbers!
