Welcome to our weekly bulletin. Below you will find lots of useful information and lovely news from your child's classroom.



This week our focus has been.... vehicles

This week Steeple Cove became creators, creating different modes of transport using junk modelling materials, the children focused on if their vehicle need wheels, and if so, how many? Would their vehicle fly?

Float? Dig?

The children used their shape recognition to recreate different vehicles using 2D shapes, a rectangle for the body of the car and circles for wheels. Steeple Cove are becoming fantastic mathematicians, especially with our shape recognition.

This year we have entered the recycled Christmas tree competition, competing against other schools, local groups and charities. Whenever a Gig is available (monthly) your child should complete this as that will pitch the learning to their appropriate level. Then the best way to learn and develop their skills is to play approximately 3 Garage games each time they are on TTRS. This is pitched at their personal level. Then weekly they can complete a Soundcheck. I can see some great progress from the children who are playing regularly — well done and keep it up!
