Yarmer Reception / Year One

We started the week learning about weaving within our art and design lesson. We explored new vocabulary including warp and weft which are term to describe a vertical and horizontal thread. The children had a try at weaving with paper which they really enjoyed. Within their maths, the year ones have been exploring number lines to 20. They have learnt how to make accurate jumps along a number line and have been estimating on a number line. The reception children have been carefully practising writing their numbers to 10, subitising numbers within 10 and finding missing numbers. As scientists, the children have learnt about what all living things need. I wonder if they will be able to re-call any of the things and tell you?
