Yarmer Reception / Year One

This Week

We have had yet another wonderful week in Yarmer. We are growing ever more confident with our RWInc learning, practising sounds every day. As mathematicians, we have been learning about 1 more and 1 less than a given number, Reception using numbers within 10, and Year 1 using numbers to 50. We will be moving on to length and mass next week. As geographers, we are learning about hot and cold countries. This week, we focused on animals and how they survive in their climate. For example, polar bears have thick fur to stay warm, and elephants have large ears to keep them cool. We talked about how some animals are nocturnal, they sleep during the day to stay cool, and are awake and hunt at night time. Some animals bury themselves in the sand to keep cool too. In colder climates, animals store fat to keep warm, and are climatised to the cold water so they don't feel the cold. Penguins stand together to keep warm and move within their circles to maintain their warmth. We have loved being out enjoying the sunshine and having the warmth on our faces!
