
Along with this week's bulletin, I'm also sharing our Trust Annual Report to Parents, which is packed with lots of exciting information about our wider school family.

What a fantastic week of learning we've had in Leas Foot! A real highlight was our special visit from Claire, a wonderful author who shared her story with us. She taught us about the role of an author and reminded us that learning something new can be tricky, but with perseverance, we can overcome challenges and achieve success.
